DANCING WITH THE STARS SEASON 18

Season 18 of the popular TV show, *Dancing with the Stars*, premieres on Monday, March 17 at 8 PM on ABC Television Network. Emmy Award-winning host, Tom Bergeron, is back, as well as *DWTS*'s bad boy, Maks Chmerkovskiy, but co-host Brooke Burke-Charvet has been replaced by Season 10 finalist Erin Andrews. The Harold Wheeler Band has been fired and replaced by a smaller band led by Ray Chew and more

prerecorded music. These changes are dwarfed by the biggest change: sometime mid-season, the stars who have not been eliminated will switch partners, as determined by the TV audience. Apparently, these changes are a combination of cost-cutting measures as well as a reaction to a drop in ratings since *DWTS* started competing with *The Voice* on NBC. APPLAUSE! APPLAUSE! HANDLING DANCE PERFORMANCE ANXIETY

"Nobody cares if you can't dance well. Just get up and dance. Great dancers are great because of their passion." - Martha Graham

Children have no trouble finding ways to entertain adults and grabbing the limelight, whether they sing, act, tumble or dance. Why, as adults, do we shun our childhood innocence for positive attention; why do we shun participating in dance performances where we can garner "applause, applause?"

The majority of adults taking dance classes shun the limelight, even withdrawing when the instructor tries to use them for a brief demonstration. Only a few dancers ever go on to regularly perform. Explanations vary, but it is common to hear: "I'm not good enough. I'm too shy. I'd forget my routine. I don't like people watching me dance."

Data that includes dance performance anxiety indicate that most people would rather die than perform publicly.¹ Whether speaking, singing, acting, or dancing, what is needed is a mind shift prior to taking on the performance challenge.

The mind shift is between risks and rewards. Lowering the risks and increasing the rewards is key. Realistically, there are few risks. Possible errors in a routine, a fall, freezing up or forgetting steps can all be catalogued under fear of embarrassment or failure. Yet most dance showcases are about

admiration of a dancer's courage and efforts, rather than a perfect performance.

The TV show *Dancing with the Stars* has shown us that famous people make mistakes in front of millions of viewers and share the fear of failure. Yet some of the most imperfect dancing stars become our favorites, while the perfect ones get voted off.² Audiences reward enthusiasm, passion, humility and effort rather than perfection – a striving human is prized!

Rewards for dance performances are plentiful. Taking on a challenging routine builds dance skills. Working in depth with a choreographer, dance partner or team and instructor involves finding an inspirational song and creating a work of art where the body is the instrument. Producing an authentic act of self-expression and getting a message across to the audience using the non-verbal language of dance develops confidence that spills over to the rest of a person's life. The ultimate benefit is receiving immediate applause and appreciation for the courage to

perform.

Somewhere in the transition from childhood to adulthood, we have lost our innocent desire to be seen and appreciated by others. Although there may be moments of embarrassment in life, taking a calculated risk to demonstrate proficiency in a new skill such as dance may be a worthy challenge.

The eventual result is likely to be "applause, applause" and maybe an encore. Consider also that the applause may come from audiences comprised of senior citizens or veterans who have just been entertained by dancers who came for a visit. It is not always just about the dancer, but, more so, the smiles created by sharing a common passion for dance with others. Continuing to applaud the joyful child inside all of us is what keeps dancers and dance lovers young.

Healthy Living: The Ketogenic Diet - How to Starve Cancer

The war on cancer has been going on for a very long time and we are not winning. It is estimated that one in three of us will get cancer. A basic understanding of these cancer cells will make clear why there are better ways than the generally accepted cancer treatments of trying to poison (chemo), mutilate (surgery) or burn (irradiate) the tumor.

Cancer is a *process*. Cells (the basic building blocks of your body) that, for most of your life, were doing their normal assigned functions of keeping you working in a predictable and organized manner; where each of the more than 70 *trillion cells* was doing its job, all of a sudden, some no longer followed the plan. Why these cells get derailed and go off in a different direction is fascinating. There are many known "carcinogenic," cancer-causing things, but here I want to talk about the nature of these cells and how we can use this basic nature in our favor.

What makes these cells so dangerous is that they are very fast-growing and take over, interfering with the processes of keeping you alive that normal cells are trying to carry on. That same quality of fast growth is their weakness and the basis of this article. Because they reproduce so fast, they don't fully mature and don't have all the capacities of normal cells. The most important capacity that they lack is that they are not able to burn fat for energy. Most cancer cells live on sugar only and literally starve in the absence of sugar-producing foods. Normal cells, in the absence of sugar, start the process of benign ketosis, not to be confused with ketoacidosis, which is a pathological condition in diabetes. Ketosis is using fat for energy. This is what allows people to live for a month or more just on water. Primitive man often went without food for extended periods (when McDonald's was closed in the Paleolithic age). Ketosis is the sophisticated survival capacity of our cells to get us through these periods. This sophistication is the key to using the Ketogenic Diet for starving cancer.



John Hopkins University first revealed the success of this diet with cancer in the early 90's. In the 1920's, the Ketogenic Diet was first used with great success to cure epileptics of seizure. Drs. Wilder and Peterman from the Mayo Clinic were the first pioneers of this diet as a treatment for epilepsy. The diet fell out of favor when more drugs started to be used for epileptics in the following decades. The renewed interest in the diet in the 1990's was the result of the efforts of Jim Abrahams, who, through his own research, rediscovered this diet and saved his son, Charley. Mr. Abraham started The Charley Foundation to popularize the diet for epileptics, thus resuming the interest in and use of the diet¹. As luck would have it, this resurgence of interest led the way to discovering many more benefits of eliminating sugar to heal other degenerative conditions.

Another well known, but mostly misunderstood, proponent of ketosis was Dr. Atkins, who applied ketosis to weight loss and healing heart disease, as well as arthrosclerosis, by eliminating the inflammatory effect of sugar on the lining of the arteries.

So how do you use this information if you know someone in the throes of cancer? My recommendation is to purchase "The Cantin Ketogenic Diet" by Elaine Cantin. Elaine was diagnosed with Stage IV breast cancer. She had seen several women in her family die from that diagnosis after using all that modern medicine had to offer. She did not want to follow suit and, much like what Jim Abraham did for his son, she saved herself by researching her alternatives. I recommend Elaine's book rather than the many written by MD's for four reasons. Written by a layman, it is much easier to read. She incorporated an important factor in the viability of this diet by the elimination of allergenic foods, as well as the implementation of the basic diet. She lays out the program in a very simple way, so it is easier to apply, and she relates her plan for prevention of cancer recurrence. Elaine also used several other modalities to support her body in healing itself - modalities that support the immune system, as well as the systems of detoxification, which furthered her healing process. I'm familiar with and like all of them, so this adds to the value of the book. Finally, reading the account of someone who succeeded so completely (her two-inch tumor completely disappeared in a matter of weeks) in an endeavor of life and death is inspiring. I hope that this serves to at least move you to look at the possibility of this method of healing.

KADEL'S KORNER: Some Quick Quickstep Ideas

1. "FULL STEAM AHEAD"

Use standard timing throughout: a) Having danced six steps of the Natural Spin Turn around a corner to back DC of the new LOD, start a V6 on its second step (RF back).

b) Dance steps # 6, 7 and 8 of the V6 to face the LOD.

c) Follow with 3 steps of the Quick Open Reverse and a Reverse Pivot (½ turn to the left to face the LOD again). Use count Slow or "and" on Reverse Pivot.

d) Dance a full Double Reverse Spin (from facing LOD to facing LOD).

e) Repeat 3 steps of the Quick Open

Reverse, dancing ½ turn to the left again. f) Follow with 4 Quick Run to DW.

This group shows maximum amounts of turn to ensure a powerful and continuous flow of reverse turns.



2. TURNING A "DON'T" INTO A "DO"

There are two types of Fishtails: one starts facing DC and ends facing DW. The other starts facing DW and goes nowhere. But is this "carved in stone?"

Let's try something:

a) Dance a full Natural Spin Turn or an underturned Outside Spin or a Closed Impetus Turn at a corner to back DC.

b) Dance all five steps of the Progressive Chasse (to the Left) to face DW.

c) Now dance the Fishtail with a ¼ turn to the right (as given in the Book*) to end facing DW against the LOD (not given in the Book).

d) Take the LF back to connect with group #1, but starting the V6 on its first step.

REMEMBERING FRANK REGAN

In 1962, Frank Regan came for staff training to our Arthur Murray Studio in Hartford, CT, for the first time as a primary representative of the English style of ballroom dancing and of the USISTD, then in its infancy. Accompanying him was his professional partner, Connie Diamond, both just having arrived from Scotland. Frank had become dance director at Arthur Murray's in Philadelphia and had made a name for himself as coach and trainer of the ISTD syllabus.

His early success led him to open his own studio in Ardmore, PA, which he succeeded in transforming into an absolute training center. I joined his staff in 1964 and witnessed his loyalty to his profession and to the Imperial. He invited the world's most prominent coaches to his studio, making it a legendary location in the early development of international style in the US. Regular guest teachers included Alex Moore, Harry Tucker, Connie Grant, Masie Harrison, Major Eric Hancox, Guy Howard, Elizabeth Romaine, Peter Eggleton with Brenda Winslade, Bill and Bobby Irvine, etc., all offering coaching, tests and exams. Frank also had a great permanent



staff, who would later achieve much fame in our profession. These were Bill Davies, Glennis Dee, as well as Warren Cooper, who would become the first Fellow, H.C. in our area and, never lastly, Steve Hadley.

Frank's dedication to the ISTD caused him never to miss a meeting of the Imperial Society, then always held in NYC. He would make certain to gather all of us in his old Volkswagen van, the back of which was always filled with ballgowns that he had made for students, to attend those early days of the ISTD. In the old days ISTD

meetings consisted often of just about a dozen members.

Frank's constant companion, Aleta Marcy, became his new dance partner around 1970, as he trained her to his championship level. Together, they competed and trained dance teachers all over the US. Aleta would stay to operate the Ardmore studio, long after his wife, Vicky, came into Frank's life.

Frank and Vicky left the Philadelphia area to seek their success elsewhere. With many US & Canadian national titles and a USISTD Lifetime Achievement Award, Frank will be remembered as one of the greatest contributors to the success and perpetuation of the USISTD.

In Greek philosophy, the true purpose of life is to do good. Frank has exceeded this calling by a huge and untold margin. Thanks, Frank, thanks for the memory. We will keep dancing for and because of you!!!






